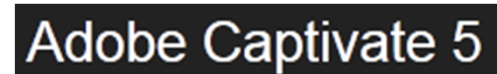
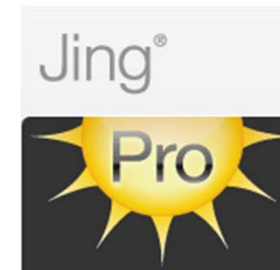


How I've used Screencasts

- Database Page
- Any page by a Catalog or Databases link
- On a Catalog 404 Page
- Playing in a loop on a monitor by the Circulation/Information/Reference Desk(s)
- In an email template – ready to send
